



GAME CREATION TIPS

If you've tried the Ben 10: Alien Force Game Creator, you already know how to make a game online. But did you know you can use the same steps to invent a game outside? Give it a shot!

1 BACKGROUND

Where do you want to play your game?
Are there special requirements for the playing field?

2 HEROES

Who are the stars of the team? How many players do you need?
What are the players supposed to do?
What can the players **NOT** do?

3 LEVEL DESIGN

Other than the Red Rubber Ball, what objects do you need to play your game?

4 GOAL

How do you win your game?
How does the game end?

GAME STARTER:

It's always exciting to start from scratch. But if you need some ideas, try picking a Game Starter! Think of a game that already exists, and then add something that **KICKS IT INTO ACTION!**

HERE'S AN EXAMPLE OF HOW SOMEONE MIGHT HAVE MADE UP FOUR SQUARE:

1 BACKGROUND

Four Square is played on a square court divided into four smaller squares, numbered 1, 2, 3 and 4. The ground has to be hard so the Red Rubber Ball can bounce.

2 HEROES

You need at least four players for Four Square. Players hit the Red Rubber Ball into another player's square with their hands. Players can't knock the ball out of bounds or let the ball bounce more than once in their square. If any player does this, he or she is out, and everyone shifts up a square.

3 LEVEL DESIGN

You need sidewalk chalk or masking tape to mark off the squares.

4 GOAL

Whoever stays in the #4 square the longest is the winner.

WANT TO ADD AN EXTRA CHALLENGE?

Pick a category -- like countries, types of cereal or former presidents. When players bounce the ball, they have to call out an item in that category. If you repeat something that's already been said, or can't come up with anything that fits into the category, you're out!
